**Conclusion:**  
Based on this data, Freshman through Senior students are somewhat overrepresented in UHS individual visits relative to their numbers in the entire student body.  
For UHS group visits Sophomore, Senior, Graduate and Professional students in year 4 are overrepresented in group visits relative to their numbers in the entire student body.

The most pronounced high users for both types of visits are Seniors for both individual and group visits and Graduate students for group visits.
