2. Budget Introduction (4:05 to 4:20 p)

- Presentation with slides
- Question from Jake: will a more built out budget be presented at the next HCAC meeting?
- Question from Roberta: What is a seg fee? Fee that is outside of tuition that students pay for auxiliary services. Students can weigh in on how they want the funds to be spent. Seg fees make up 92% of UHS operating budget and means almost all of the services students access are fully covered at no additional cost to students.
- Question from Roberta: Is the 12% increase on top of last year's fee? Answer: yes.
- Question from Beth: any idea why campus did not approve the 10% last year and any expectation this would happen again? Answer: desire to spend

down reserves. Vacancies/lapsed salaries over the years contributed to the large reserves. Have had more success in hiring this past year which means less lapsed salaries. The institution also looks at the whole segregated fee and takes the full package of what students are paying into consideration.

- Question from Roberta: Does the university cap segregated fees at a certain percentage? Not technically. Several factors considered. Want to keep annual increases as minimal as possible.

3. UHS Violence Prevention Presentation (4:20 to 5:00 p)

- Question from Muaz: if sexual assaults aren't reported, where are you getting this information? Anonymous survey.
- Question from Muaz: did students say why they didn't report? Plug in 2019 AAU survey. Students cited it wasn't serious enough to seek external help and they could handle it on their own.
- Question from Roberta: when you refer to research and results in the lab, are you referring to survey? What is the lab? Do you ever share this with external institutions? That research wasn't conducted on our campus. Most prominent scholar in this area Antonia Abbey from Wayne State University.
- Question from Thomas: has research been done on what trainings are most effective for students? Have not done control studies around educational interventions but have looked at results by population (e.g. athletes vs. not, Greek life vs. not, etc.) When developing pull from a body of research on what is most impactful. With annual GetWise

series, can gain information on what students are seeking.

- Question from Noreen: How much ability does UHS have in making some of those off-campus spaces more safe for students? E.g. Greek Life. Also, what feedback have you received from students on the impact of GetWise and SOAR presentations? Have strong relationships with campus partners. Have strong working relationships with students but this is constantly changing as students graduate. Partner with RCC on safer bar program. Most feedback on trainings is to make it more engaging and scenario based, canvas fatigue, etc.
- Question from Tori: How many students are being surveyed? About 7,500 in 2019 AAU survey.

- Comment from Jake: removing session limits for MHS impacted numbers. Pharmacy does not have embedded providers like many other units which may account for some of the lower rates there.
